UPDATES AND NEW PARTNERS

Deb has been in conversation with **Stand Together**, and they are currently working to schedule a walk-through One Voice's facility. They are planning to vet One Voice in 2025 ahead of the next funding cycle, and One Voice will be considered for funding in 2026.

Brighter Life will be renting office space and will be placing a counselor on site two days a week for children and adults (Tuesdays and Thursdays). They are going to partner at both One Voice locations in Raleigh and Wyoming Counties.

One Voice has signed a consultative contract with **Mountain Laurel**, with plans to rent office space when a certified peer is hired. One Voice is searching for a peer but is having trouble finding someone who is certified. Their plans are to place a Community Health Worker and a nurse practitioner onsite at One Voice. In January, One Voice signed an MOU with Mountain Laurel to partner on a grant funding opportunity, along with Coalfield Development.

One Voice is partnering with **Coalfield Development's WRAPS** (Workforce Readiness and Professional Success) program to provide job training and personal development curriculum for local people facing barriers to employment in Wyoming County. Coalfield has supported One Voice during the past months by providing flood relief items that One Voice can distribute to those in need. Coalfield Development is also collaborating with One Voice on an Appalachian Regional Commission (ARC) grant application.

Together for Hope is supporting One Voice on a **Benedum Foundation** Grant. They are helping to develop a training model, curriculum, Recovery Community Organization (RCO) replication model, business model, and focused on building sustainability. Professor Harold Tessendorf is conducting a virtual walk-through of One Voice in March.

By the Numbers



- → Conducted 44 CARE intakes.
- → Distributed 12 Narcan Kits.
- → Facilitated 581 referrals by the CARE team.
- → Assisted 5 with admission to treatment.
- → Trained 19 in Adult Mental Health First Aid
- → Referred 100% of clients to Primary (Family HealthCare) and Dental Care (Oceana Dental).
- Continued collection of intake and reassessment data and monitoring of outcome data.
